ADDITIONAL OPPORTUNITIES

Title: **Women of the ELCA** Facilitators: Pastors, various Circle members
Locations: Rooms 156, 158, New Aldaya and various homes TIME: hours vary from early morning, mid morning, afternoon and evening.
Description: Women of the ELCA is the churchwide organization for all women who are members of Nazareth. The three main areas of focus are:
1) Discipleship – Monthly Bible study found in the GATHER magazine. Five Circles meet monthly on a Wednesday or Thursday to study God's Word.
2) Justice – Each month a specific topic such as human trafficking, spiritual hospitality, needs of the deaf community, advocacy, gender equality, assisting veterans) is discussed to bring awareness to the group;
3) Stewardship – An active Kits & Quilts group meets 3 times a month to create quilts, gather supplies and pack school bags, baby care kits, personal care kits and fabric kits for distribution through Lutheran World Relief. A Prayer Shawl ministry that creates prayer shawls, mantles, baby blankets for baptisms and infants caps is open to anyone wishing to knit or crochet.

Title: **Online Mentoring**
God calls every single Christ follower to be a faith sharer; a spiritual multiplier. If that's an area where you want/need to grow, online mentoring might be perfect for you. Through Naz's partnership with The Life Project and The Digital Doorway, you'll be trained to respond to anonymous online messages sent to you from hurting/lonely/questioning people looking for answers on the Internet. Training and mentoring online as available. Mentors will be invited gather periodically to share insights, tips, and stories.
