

At Nazareth, we want to lift up vibrant singing as an integral part of our time together on Sunday mornings. Using Spotify, these "Music Spotlights" are designed to encourage and familiarize us with the music for the upcoming weekend so that we can wholeheartedly sing as we worship together.

This coming weekend, we will sing "I Stand *Amazed,"* – a Gospel hymn written by Charles Gabriel (1856-1932), who grew up on a farm in Wilton, Iowa. Six years after the Civil War ended, lingering war melodies inspired this 15-year-old lowa boy to tell his parents that he planned to become a songwriter – aspirations his parents encouraged. A musician self-taught on a reed organ in his childhood home, Gabriel became one of the most prolific writers of Gospel music of his day. Despite frequently using numerous pseudonyms (making it difficult to know the precise number of songs he wrote), he is credited with between 7,000 and 8,000 songs, thirtyfive gospel song collections, Sunday school songbooks, collections for men's and women's choirs, numerous cantatas (including 41 Christmas cantatas), and music education texts. Gabriel is also credited with writing the beloved hymn, "His Eye is On the Sparrow."

"I Stand Amazed" is a hymn of gratitude and praise for the atoning death of Jesus. Throughout history, the hymn has ranged from three to five verses, but it has a singular focus: the pure amazement at the incredible sacrifice of Christ! To this day, Gabriel's hymn continues to be reworked in several contemporary Christian music circles. Listen to "I Stand Amazed," along with the music for Sunday on Spotify:
