

MUSIC SPOTLIGHT

At Naz, we want to lift up vibrant, congregational singing as an integral part of our time together on Sunday mornings. "Music Spotlights" are designed to encourage and help familiarize us with the music for the upcoming weekend so we can sing in full voice as we worship together.

This coming weekend, we will sing, "The First Noel," which is one of the oldest Christmas ballads still sung today. Though it first appeared in print in 1833, the carol goes back at least 300 years prior to that. The exact place or time of its origin are in doubt, with both France and England claiming it as part of their heritage. The spelling of "Noel" would seem to indicate a French connection, but there seems to be more evidence pointing to this carol migrating from Britain to France.

The word "Noel" means a joyful shout expressing the exhilaration at the birth of Christ. While the carol's anonymous writer knew enough about language to use this all-encompassing term to begin the chorus, the author wildly missed the mark on several Scriptural points in this song. For example, the Bible does not mention the star with the shepherds - only the wisemen. Such writing errors would have been normal at that time – especially before Bibles were in circulation - and it suggests that the writer was illiterate and common as he/she drew from stories of Christ's birth passed down through the years. Accordingly, for the first 300 years of its existence, "The First Noel" was not a part of religious services; clergy wouldn't allow new songs in church services, even if they embraced a story from the Scriptures. Rather, the carol became the holiday voice of the people – those who embraced the wonder of God sending a Son to save every man and woman, no matter their station in life. Thus, when a lawyer who was particularly fond of French and English folk songs finally published it in 1833, they had already become a favorite of many people.

NOTICE FROM THE CHURCH COUNCIL

Good morning! As your church council president, I wanted to bring to your attention a few updates. First, many of you may have noticed our new sign that was recently installed along University Avenue. We Praise God for the generosity of one of our members who facilitated this project in honor of his late wife. We believe this sign will be a useful communication tool for many years to come.

As I mentioned earlier this fall, the church council appointed a committee to update the church by-laws now that we have changed affiliations to the North American Lutheran Church. The committee has been meeting every Tuesday morning at 6:30 am, working hard and will hopefully have a final draft ready for congregational approval at the annual meeting in January. After that, we'll consider the appropriate steps for the call process.

In the meantime, many of you might remember when Pastor Mike put up a slide during one of his sermons that read: "What are we doing to put Nazareth in the best possible position to be the most faithful witness to the Gospel of Jesus Christ?" That slide became a catalyst for Mike, Tim, and me to begin conversations about what roles they each can play in living into that statement. In light of those conversations, the church council, along with Mike and Tim, have decided to clarify their roles to better align with their giftedness. Pastor Mike's new title will be Lead Shepherding and Discipleship pastor. He will be responsible for guiding discipleship ministries for children, students, adults, and families. He will also continue to do some of the preaching for our worship services. Pastor Tim, who is currently part-time, will now be full-time and his title will be Lead Preaching and Evangelism pastor. Tim will be responsible for preaching the majority of the time and will be supervising the planning of our Sunday morning worship experience. Both Mike and Tim are excited about these newly defined roles, as is the church council.

Lastly, I'd like to mention that this is a great time of year to invite a family member, friend, neighbor, co-worker or even a new acquaintance to come visit us here at Nazareth. Oftentimes, people will respond positively to... and even appreciate an invitation to a worship service over the holidays, especially from a trusted friend.

And let's all keep our hearts open with love and a spirit of hospitality to all those who come through our doors throughout this season, as we continue working to make this a welcoming place for all to experience the love of Jesus through us and by His Spirit.
