

MUSIC SPOTLIGHT

At Nazareth, we lift up vibrant, congregational singing as an integral part of our time together on Sunday mornings. Using Spotify, "Music Spotlight" is designed to encourage and help familiarize us with the music selections for the upcoming weekend so that we can wholeheartedly sing in full voice as we worship together.

This coming weekend, we will sing, "God, Whose Giving Knows No Ending," which was written by Robert Edwards, a pastor who was born in 1915 and served churches throughout New England. In addition to authoring several hymn texts, Edwards was instrumental in establishing low-income senior housing, in prison ministry, and in other community endeavors aimed at helping those in need. Edwards died in 2006 and this hymn endures still today as his most famous work.

Although "God, Whose Giving Knows No Ending" appears in our Lutheran hymnal (#678), the text is not set to a tune that is familiar to our congregation nor is it easily-recognized by its title alone. However, in hopes of utilizing a rich message centered on being thankful for God's gifts (both tangible and intangible) and – in turn – sharing those blessings with the world around us, the text is written with a rhythm/meter that can be applied to a more familiar tune. Accordingly, we will sing this hymn to the familiar tune of "Come, Thou Fount of Every Blessing."

BASIC Update

The focus of this trip is RELATIONSHIPS -- which is why it is often called a "RELATIONtrip" instead of a "MISSION trip." Students and leaders will focus on our relationship with God, each other and the community they will be immersed in.
