

MUSIC SPOTLIGHT

We want to lift up vibrant, congregational singing as an integral part of our time together on Sunday mornings. Using Spotify, these "Music Spotlights" are designed to encourage us and help familiarize us with the music selections for Sunday so that we can sing in full voice as we worship together.

This coming weekend, we will sing "Joy to the World" – an English hymn written by Isaac Watts and sung to Lowell Mason's arrangement of a tune attributed to George Frederic Handel. Drawing on a paraphrase of Psalm 98, "Joy to the World" has a peculiar place in hymnody. That is, while "Joy to the World" is primarily sung at Christmas, it makes no single, specific reference to the birth of Christ: no stable, no shepherds, no wise men, no Mary or Joseph, no Bethlehem, no angels, no silent nights. In fact, in our hymnals, it appears as an Advent hymn – most likely as a reference to the second coming of Christ. When reading the hymn's text through a lens of Christ's second coming, we find that the lyrics make a lot of sense.

So why do we sing this song at Christmas? It is clearly a song about Christ's second coming when the full expression of his glory will be revealed. It doesn't really have anything to do with the Christmas story. Or does it? After all, there is no second coming without a first coming. During Advent, as Christians, we can anticipate the second coming of Christ and the life of the world to come even as we remember and celebrate when Christ first came to us at Christmas. Navigating Family Conflict

Good morning! As your church council president, I wanted to bring to your attention a few updates. First, many of you may have noticed our new sign that was recently installed along University Avenue. We Praise God for the generosity of one of our members who facilitated this project in honor of his late wife. We believe this sign will be a useful communication tool for many years to come.

As I mentioned earlier this fall, the church council appointed a committee to update the church by-laws now that we have changed affiliations to the North American Lutheran Church. The committee has been meeting every Tuesday morning at 6:30 am, working hard and will hopefully have a final draft ready for congregational approval at the annual meeting in January. After that, we'll consider the appropriate steps for the call process.

In the meantime, many of you might remember when Pastor Mike put up a slide during one of his sermons that read: "What are we doing to put Nazareth in the best possible position to be the most faithful witness to the Gospel of Jesus Christ?" That slide became a catalyst for Mike, Tim, and me to begin conversations about what roles they each can play in living into that statement. In light of those conversations, the church council, along with Mike and Tim, have decided to clarify their roles to better align with their giftedness. Pastor Mike's new title will be Lead Shepherding and Discipleship pastor. He will be responsible for guiding discipleship ministries for children, students, adults, and families. He will also continue to do some of the preaching for our worship services. Pastor Tim, who is currently part-time, will now be full-time and his title will be Lead Preaching and Evangelism pastor. Tim will be responsible for preaching the majority of the time and will be supervising the planning of our Sunday morning worship experience. Mike, Tim, and the Council are excited about these newly defined roles.

Lastly, I'd like to mention that this is a great time of year to invite a family member, friend, neighbor, co-worker or even a new acquaintance to come visit us here at Nazareth. Oftentimes, people will respond positively to... and even appreciate an invitation to a worship service over the holidays, especially from a trusted friend.

And let's all keep our hearts open with love and a spirit of hospitality to all those who come through our doors throughout this season, as we continue working to make this a welcoming place for all to experience the love of Jesus through us and by His Spirit.
