

At Nazareth, we want vibrant singing to be an integral part of our Sunday mornings. Using Spotlify, these "Music Spotlights" are designed to encourage and familiarize us with the music for the upcoming weekend so that we can wholeheartedly sing as we worship together.

As we celebrate Palm Sunday this weekend, we will close our service by singing "Lift High the Cross" – a hymn rooted in the Anglican tradition. The year was 1887 when the Society approached the Reverend Dr. George William Kitchen for the Propagation of the Gospel, the Church of England's worldwide missionary organization, looking for a triumphant processional hymn for an upcoming festival. Debuting in Winchester Cathedral, Kitchen's work originally consisted of 11 verses but was later rearranged in 1916 by Michael Robert Newbolt, an Anglican priest. The hymn is a European staple often sung during Lent and Easter, but no Christians in America ever sang the hymn until it was published with the recommendation of Donald Paul Hustad in "Hymns for the Living Church" in 1974; Hustad spent 60 years in ministry as an organist, with the Moody Bible Institute's radio station, and most notably – with the Billy Graham Evangelical Association.


As Christians navigate an increasingly secular and hostile culture, it's important to never shy away from the physical symbol of Christ's sacrifice, death, and resurrection. Metaphorically speaking, lifting high the cross of Christ manifests in numerous ways – from openly professing and witnessing to living out the faith through our everyday interactions. It may have taken nearly 100 years for "Lift High the Cross" to make its way across the Atlantic Ocean, but – now that it's here – Christians would be wise to sing and live it daily.
