

MUSIC SPOTLIGHT

At Nazareth, we want vibrant singing to be an integral part of our Sunday mornings. Using Spotify, these "Music Spotlights" are designed to encourage and familiarize us with the music for the upcoming weekend so that we can wholeheartedly sing as we worship together.

This coming weekend, we will sing "Here I Am, Lord," – a hymn written by Wisconsin native Daniel Schutte (b. 1947). This hymn has Catholic origins. It was first written in 1979, rapidly gained popularity, and was published widely across several denominations by 1981. Currently serving as Composer-In-Residence at the University of San Francisco, Schutte continues to compose Catholic and contemporary Christian liturgical music. Notable Christian artists, including Amy Grant and John Michael Talbot, have recorded his compositions, and his music is credited in secular movies and television shows (e.g., Dark Waters, Everybody Loves Raymond, and Will and Grace).

Drawing on Isaiah 6:8, "Here I Am, Lord" remains Schutte's most well-known sacred composition. Each verse of the hymn reflects a paradox. That is, the powerful God, creator of "sea and sky," "snow and rain," and "wind and flame," is also the God who hears the "people cry," bears the "people's pain," and "tend the poor and lame." Also, it's a hymn of transformation. That is, God transforms the darkness into light in verse one, melts "hearts of stone" with love in verse two, and nourishes the "poor and lame" with the "finest bread" – a clear Eucharistic reference – in verse three. Finally, an unusual attribute of this hymn is the change in point of view that the singer makes between the verses and the refrain. The verses speak from the perspective of God in the first person singular, while the refrain, though remaining in first person, is from the perspective of the singers of the hymn offering their lives to God.
